

Johns Hopkins Police Accountability Board Disclosure Reporting Form & Guidance

Each disclosure must address three things: (1) Board member's name, (2) whether there are **relevant** financial relationships (or not) and (3) whether there are **relevant** nonfinancial relationships (or not) to Johns Hopkins University, any law enforcement, or criminal justice agency **within the past 3 years**. Board Members need only disclose those relationships that are relevant to and may influence their perspectives or decisions on the Johns Hopkins Police Accountability Board (JHPB).

Financial Relationships

Financial relationships may include receiving a salary, royalty, intellectual property rights, gifts, speaking fee, consulting fee, honorarium, ownership interest, or other financial benefit. Financial relationships can also include "contracted research" in which the institution receives the grant, manages the funds, and the individual is the principal or named investigator on the grant.
