To keep you informed:

It has been reported to Public Safety that a fondling incident took place near Guilford Ave and 33rd St. This incident was reported to have taken place on the afternoon of Saturday August 2nd, 2025, at approximately 1pm. Baltimore Police Department has been contacted and is investigating this incident.

Safety Information

The responsibility for violence prevention rests with those who use violence. Being subjected to violence is never your fault. We encourage anyone who has experienced violence to seek support using the above resources. The following information is provided to help you and your community stay safe:

- **Remember that being placed in an unsafe situation is not your fault.** You did not do anything wrong. It is the person who engaged in the behavior that is to blame.
- **You are not obligated to do anything you don't want to do.** A person's boundaries should always be honored. It is not your fault if another person disregards your wishes.
